Botox Post-Treatment Care

- The most common side effects are headache and temporary injection-related reactions such as tenderness, swelling, redness and sometimes bruising.
- A cold compress may be used for comfort if desired.
- Another possible side effect is ptosis (drooping) of the eyelid or eyebrow, which is caused by migration of the toxin. This is rare and temporary and can be treated with special eyedrops.
- Avoid rubbing the treatment site for the first 4 hours. This may cause migration of the toxin out of the desired area.
- Results begin to appear in 2-3 days and will continue to improve for up to 7 days.
- Some very deep wrinkles may require the addition of a dermal filler such as Restylane.
- Treatment will last 3 months or more and should then be repeated to prevent lines from reappearing. Over time the muscles will be re-trained and less frequent treatments will be required.
